#### **Assistant Director**

Wow, February already! Just a month or so and we can begin to ride again in earnest. Are you getting ready? As avid or even occasional riders we spend a fair amount of time and money preparing our bikes for the riding season, but what about keeping *ourselves* in shape?

I'm not a big guy, so keeping my Ultra under control while backing up and during those awkward off-balance stops can be a bit challenging, especially when riding with someone special behind me as I usually do. I look at it as a combination of skill, balance, and strength mixed in with experience. I am certainly no expert, but I thought I'd share my thoughts with you on this.

Skill comes from knowledge and experience. So first off, if you're new to riding or ride thousands of miles a year, a skilled <u>Rider Safety Course</u> is a great way to hone your riding expertise. Listening to other riders and how they handle difficult situations is invaluable in my book. During the winter I try to stay up to date with the *HOG Magazine* safety stories and experiences, as well as review books I have received over the years on "heavy weight" bike control with practical suggestions and "What to do if.." scenarios.

At the start of the riding season, I do figure 8's in the street or a parking lot along with riding as slow as possible in a straight line. Both of these exercises require finding the sweet spot with the clutch and rear brake, which helps with those inevitable U-turns. Doing a few quick stops with feet on the rests until you stop gets you used to keeping the bike straight, important if you want to avoid those embarrassing moments at a light or backing into a spot when you have to struggle to stay up.

Strength and balance are key as well and can be improved by doing something as simple as deep knee bends (squats), push-ups and leg raises. Doing them consistently every day or so will give you the best results. Work Out World and Planet Fitness both have decent programs and aren't that expensive. YouTube even offers some good routines for isometric exercises. Any way you do it will really help when you find yourself in an "Oh Sh\*t" moment!

Here's to an early spring with a good dose of rain to wash the salt and sand off the road!

#### Historian's Article

Greetings fellow HOG members and Happy New Year.

Here we are in winter riding hibernation, but thoughts of spring and riding again abound in our minds. Winter gives me, as our chapter historian, time to do research... something I love to do anyway.

So I want to go back some 30 plus years ago to write about how *President Regan* helped out *Harley-Davidson* by imposing tariffs on foreign made motorcycles. A big part of the history of *Harley-Davidson* during difficult financial times. The tariffs were imposed in 1983 to help protect the only lone American bike maker still in the market. The Japanese bike makers, according to Japan's Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry (RIETI), said sales of smaller-engine Japanese bikes jumped from 43% to the total of 60% in 1983 and later.

So President Regan imposed tariffs on the foreign made bikes. He raised the current tariff of 4.4 percent to 49.4 percent in the first year of the five-year program. By giving the sole American motorcycle maker some breathing room from competition to retool, Harley was able to get its act together, turn profitable, and even request the tariff protection be ended early.

Even though the *Harley-Davidson* of today faces sliding sales, dwindling profits, and stiff competition from *Polaris Industries*, which is stealing some market share with the *Indian Motorcycle* nameplate to go along with its existing big-bike, *Victory* brand, it isn't in the same condition it was three decades ago.

Presidential politics are raising the specter of protectionism as a valid policy option once more, but using *Harley-Davidson* as a case study to validate them indicates that perhaps the wrong history lesson has been learned. It is a different economic world today than it was back in the 80's, we shall see where this *political ride* takes us.

Anyway, it's a comfort to know that our new Vice President Mike Pence rides a Street Glide, my kind of guy! Watch our Vice President's Harley charity ride video at:
